On November 18, our bishop released new pandemic guidance. "In light of worsening Covid-19 positivity rates, the crisis faced by our healthcare systems, and out of an abundance of caution and love for our neighbor, Bishop Laurie Haller and the Appointive Cabinet is directing clergy and churches to cease in-person worship and church activities through January 10, 2021."

This isn't a change for Salem, and it doesn't mean we will begin gathering in-person right after that. We'll have to see where we are in the pandemic at that point.

But it does mean Christmas, like most everything else, will be different this year. We won't gather for the Men's All Church Breakfast or the Ladies' Christmas Tea. We won't gather to make homemade blankets for children in need. There won't be a children's Christmas Pageant. We won't go caroling. And we won't gather in-person to worship and light candles. It hurts to not celebrate Christmas with all our traditions this year.

It may be different, but we will celebrate Christmas, the good news that God tore open the heavens to be with us as one of us in Jesus. Along with our regular weekly Advent

worship services, premiering 9:30 AM Sundays, we will also gather online for two special moments of worship. (See page 3 for links to our online channels.)

On Monday, December 21, the Longest Night worship service will premiere at 5 PM. The beginning of winter on December 21 brings the longest night and period of darkness. This year especially, Christmas could be difficult for many. We will gather online in a beautiful moment of worship to light candles and receive comfort in scripture and prayer, bringing Christ's light to our lives.

Then with the 12 day celebration of Jesus' birth upon us, on Thursday, December 24, the Christmas Eve worship service will premiere at 5 PM. If you want, have a candle ready to light for both services. As always, the worship videos continue to be available online anytime after they premiere, and if you need or prefer, we will provide you with a DVD of online worship.

Of course, you can celebrate on your own or with family with whom you shelter, too. Read the Christmas story in Luke 2:1-20, sing Christmas carols, light candles, pray, reflect on what it means for God to come down as one of us, and call others to spread the love and light of Christmas.

A Pastoral Letter from Bishop Laurie Regarding Her Worship Directive

As noted on the front page, our bishop has directed us to refrain from in-person worship and church activities through January 10, 2021. Two days later, on November 20, Bishop Laurie offered these words to us:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ...As you know, COVID-19 infections remain high in Iowa. In Governor Reynolds' daily briefing yesterday, she mentioned that over the past seven days, there have been 22,000 new COVID cases in the state, with a 17.5% average positivity rate. Reynolds warned, "While we may be cautiously optimistic, we have a whole lot of work to do to bring the numbers down to a level where we can safely manage the virus while getting life back to normal."

As of this writing, six of our 99 counties are below 15% positivity, 21 counties are between 15% and 20% positivity, and 76 of our counties are over 20% positivity. This is why the White House Coronavirus Task Force, in its November 15 report to lowa leaders, cautioned that "The spread in lowa is exponential and unyielding," as we close in on 200,000 total confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 2,102 deaths in lowa.

In light of the continuing COVID crisis in Iowa, which is maxing out our hospitals and putting at great risk our health workers as well as the elderly and the vulnerable, people of faith are called to respond. In a press release on Wednesday, I directed clergy and congregations to refrain from in-person indoor worship and church activities through and including January 10, 2021. This allows ample time for any families who are traveling for the holidays to quarantine before gathering in person in their churches. We do this to preserve life and the well being of our health care system and our frontline workers, who are being stretched to the limit.

Advent is coming, and our churches are now adjusting plans and preparing for

outdoor and drive-through events so that people may still have a vital Christmas experience. Thank you for the many ways in which you are creatively adjusting to this new reality and are sharing the love of lesus.

Many of us have dearly missed being physically present with our friends. I love singing Christmas carols and spending time with the children, talking about the birth of Jesus. However, by refraining from in-person worship at this time, we are being true to our call as people of faith to do no harm, do good, and stay in love with God. Our faith gives us support and encouragement but also reminds us of our responsibility to ensure that all people are safe, especially the most vulnerable among us.

Many in our state, country, and around the world are experiencing what has been called COVID fatigue. We are tired, we are weary, and we are anxious. We miss worshipping in our church buildings, and we miss being with family and friends. If you are feeling overwhelmed, please reach out to your pastor, a neighbor, or a friend. And be on the lookout yourself for ways in which you can care for others. The apostle Paul reminds us of our call and responsibility for such a time as this, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2)

Please know that all of our district superintendents and conference staff will be available to you to help with support. We are collecting Advent and Christmas resources on the lowa Conference Website for online worship and tech support. We will get through this together.

As we continue to track the trends of COVID-19 infections, we will watch for positivity rates to decline below 15%. Like you, we want to gather again for in person worship and activities and will continue to keep you updated.

Our congregation is helping "Change a Child's Story." We are accepting monetary donations to buy books for students in need.

"You're never too young for books. Reading to babies as young as six months of age leads to stronger vocabularies and better early literacy skills four years later, just as the children are getting ready to go to school." Only 53 percent of children ages three to five were read to daily by a family member. Children in families with incomes below the poverty line are less likely to be read to aloud everyday than are children in families with incomes at or above poverty. It all starts by giving a book as a gift to a child. A child can learn from a book read to them or by them reading a book to their family.

Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus who transform the world. We can transform the world when we help a child read a book. During this time of



quarantine, read a book to a child, grandchild or friend on FaceTime or Zoom or video. It makes a huge difference in their life.

In December, Salem and the Outreach Team typically host the Project Linus event, a community mission project to make blankets for underprivileged or seriously ill children in our area. Even though Salem won't be able to host the Project Linus event this year due to COVID-19, you can still help by donating fleece tie blankets or materials. Here are the details:

• Fleece:

- two pieces, each measuring a minimum of two and a half yards, one solid color and one matching pattern piece
- must be smoke-free, food-free, pet-free, and please don't put them into scented garbage bags
- If making fleece tie blankets:
- * must have two knots in each tie
- completed blankets must be delivered to Crystal Ellis before Saturday, Dec. 19

Report of the Leadership Board

Due to social distancing restrictions with the COVID-19 pandemic, the Salem Leadership Board met off site via Zoom. The monthly Board meeting opened with prayer at 5:35 PM. Those attending the virtual meeting were Troy Bergmann, Donna Sanders, Brian Schooley, Amy Schilling, Don Kamara, Dave Davis, Jeremy Hague, Billie Shaffer, Linda Curson, and Pastor John Louk.

Stewardship - Linda Curson presented a summary of Salem's finances which continue to hold steady. As of October, Salem was approximately \$32,000 over expenses. There will be some extra expenses in November as the church pays off work completed for cleaning up and repairing damage from the derecho. In addition to the general fund, the building fund currently has approximately 5.2 months in reserve income. Linda recently attended a webinar by Vanco, the company that processes our online payments, and presented additions to their platform that we may be able to utilize in the future, including the ability to make reservations in their app. Guidance regarding the PPP Loan was finally established and paperwork was completed, signed, and submitted. The entirety of Salem's PPP Loan of \$35,000 will be forgiven. At the suggestion of the Iowa Conference, paperwork was filed to help protect Salem against class action lawsuits from the Boy Scouts of America filing for bankruptcy.

Trustees - A summary of derecho mitigation and restoration was presented, including: tree damage (stump grinding) work finished week of October 12. Remaining treeline (west end alongside field) to be addressed in spring, main building exterior repair work finished except for shingle replacement (to be done soon), mold inspection still to be scheduled, interior work can commence once finished (sanctuary ceiling, ceiling tile replacement, carpet shampooing), lower level damages are minor – need to ask for a team to assist (replacement of trim and carpet cleaning), along with battery back-up sump installation. Additionally, work continues to prepare for the demolition and removal of the west outbuilding. Most items have been moved to the east building with the exception of some additional furniture and stained glass windows that will be moved in the near future. The Board will also continue to talk about the long term plan of furniture pieces currently being stored.

SPRC - The Board received a couple of resignations recently. Scott Shaffer, who was working as the custodian has resigned. The Board thanks Scott for all his work while holding this position, as well as additional work he did helping the Trustees with various projects. Dave Clark who has been serving on the Leadership Board has decided to step down from the Board effective immediately. The Board appreciates Dave's commitment to Salem and for serving the past two years.

Additional Discussion - The Board spent a short time discussing the continued

closure. Bishop Laurie Haller recently sent a message to all conference churches strongly urging them to avoid in person worship as the pandemic worsened in our area. Additional safety measures are being taken by staff and recording of weekly services will now be done separately so people are not in the same area to avoid exposure. The Board did discuss the success of the drive-thru communion and an additional drive-thru communion will be held on December 6, 2020 at 11 AM. In conjunction with staff, the Board has developed an outreach plan to contact the congregation to check in and engage in fellowship. Amy Shilling has completed a list for Board and Staff to reach out and contact and work in reaching out will continue.

Meeting closed with prayer at 6:55 PM.
