

3-10 CONNECT

Almost every week, someone new visits our church. As much as we may feel like home at Salem, they may feel like a stranger and it is up to us to change that. We want them to know that we are glad they are here and that they are welcome in the family of God. There is a simple concept called 3-10-connect. It means that at the end of our worship services for the first 3 minutes look around in a 10-foot radius from where you are sitting. If you

see someone in that space that you don't know, extend a handshake and say hi. You could simply say, "I don't think I know you." Then introduce yourself and make conversation with them as you walk out of the sanctuary together. You see, now you have made a connection with that person and they have with you. If

it turns out they have questions about our church, you can connect them further. You can physically take them to the welcome center or introduce them to a pastor, church staff member, or someone you know who can help them. The idea is 3-10-Connect. Focus on the newcomer for the first 3 minutes after worship. Know that your mission field is a 10-foot radius from where you are sitting. Connect them with another person in the church. 3-10-connect. Let's start this Sunday!


LEAGUE 33

When I was 19 years old, I started attending a small United Methodist Church in Bettendorf, Iowa. I had no idea you were allowed to bang on drums and shred electric guitars in church. We sang the hymns of our faith and I fell in love with liturgy. I love traditional worship.

Today I am in the office in shorts and flip flops. Some Sundays I wear a suit. Some Sunday's I'm in jeans. I love both modern and traditional styles of worship. When we worship in Spirit and in truth, God is glorified. I want people to feel comfortable coming to church no matter what they wear or what style of worship connects with them.

When people ask me if I prefer modern or traditional worship....my answer is usually.....of course! It is through different mediums of church that I have grown in love of God and love of neighbor.

Most days I don't really look like a pastor. I have tattoos and piercings. My family and life is not perfect. I feel I have never really arrived in my faith. But here is what I know. I love Jesus. He has changed my life and transformed me into something new...and most days....better than I used to be.

And just on occasion...such as above...I kind of look like a pastor.
