

Digital Church

In the 1983 hit movie, "Risky Business," there is a famous scene where Tom Cruise slides across the floor in his socks wearing underwear and a button up shirt. I remember in 1993 my dad doing the same thing in our kitchen. Thankfully he was wearing pants. I asked, "What are you doing?" He exclaimed, "I'm surfing the net! We have dial up baby!"

I am old enough to remember a time without internet and cell phones. We are witnessing the greatest shift in the church in the last 500 years. Not since the invention of the printing press has our methodology for ministry been affected like this. Since Covid-19, pastors and laity are fulfilling their calls in ways they were never trained for. I am encouraged by all the ways our church has stepped up in this unusual time.

I have an extensive background in worship technology. In addition to being a full time pastor, I extend audio/visual consulting for churches all over the state of lowa by helping them develop their sanctuary sound and visual systems. During the pandemic, many churches were scrambling to figure out how to do "digital church." The demand for my time in this arena has never been greater. I have traveled to several congregations and have conducted webinars for the annual conference to help lead lowa forward during this time. It is not uncommon for me to be in 1-3 different zip codes a week consulting with other congregations on how they break into this digital space.

The pandemic has taught us several things but I would highlight two key things.

The first, is that by bringing church to the internet, we have discovered an evangelistic opportunity that we were unaware of before. Most congregations experienced higher engagements for online worship than they ever did with in person worship before the pandemic. That is true for us at Salem. While we normally have about 160 people in the building on a given Sunday, we have almost twice that many interactions online with our worship services. We are reaching more people for Christ than we ever thought was possible.

The second, is that the internet is the new front door of the church. Statistically speaking, most people who visit a church for the first time have already tried to google that church. If you don't have a website/social media account and livestream your worship online, you are invisible to first time guests. When I speak to our first-time guests that visit our church, almost all of them tell me they first encountered us online. Those who are part of our congregation also value digital church if they are traveling, or find themselves homebound.

We have brought a Technical Director on our staff to help bring consistent excellence to our online ministries as well as in person worship. We have a Communication Director on staff that helps with our website and our social media pages. Most of our Bible studies and meetings we hold at church are done in a hybrid fashion so people can attend online. We are intentionally aligned as a congregation to continue to meet people at the new front door...the internet.

I am grateful for the ways Salem has stepped forward innovatively as we continue to reach people with the Gospel by all means necessary. I'm proud of you!

New Sermon Series: Fire and Brimstone

On May 1 we will be kicking off a 5-week series we are calling, "Fire and Brimstone". The book of Revelation is one of the most confusing and misunderstood books we find in the Bible.

Listen....I know it sounds pretty intense. When we think of the book of Revelation, often times our mind goes straight to the idea of the end of time, judgement, and possibly the apocalypse. When read this way, you can pretty much cue the background music that goes doom, doom, doom, doom. Many of us have been brought up encountering this book in ways that feel scary and unknown. Unfortunately, most churches don't have any robust teaching on this book so we are left with unhealthy theology and conspiracy theories to guide our biblical understanding.

We are going to look at it in a new way.

- 1. **Jesus in the Middle**---Revelation 1:12-20 May 1
- 2. **Jesus on the** Throne---Revelation 6:1-8, 8:1, 8:6-9, 7:3-4 May 8
- 3. The Cosmic Battle---Revelation 12:1-15 May 15
- 4. The Hope of Judgement---Revelation 19:11-15 May 22
- 5. **All Things New---**Revelation 21:1-5, 22:1-5, 21:22-25 May 29

This series intends to address how the themes in Revelation were intended to shine hope for people who were oppressed or struggling. It was meant to convey how God will move on our behalf in the future. We are going to meet the dramatic metaphors and analogies head on in order to find the Good News intended for us. It is my hope that by the end, you will read this book with new eyes. I trust you will find it contains great hope and not fire and brimstone. I can't wait!

Report of the Leadership Board

The monthly Board meeting opened at 5:30 PM. Those attending were Amy Schilling, Donna Sanders, *Richard Pankey, Brian Schooley, *Deb Fritz, Jan Graham, Jan Johnson, and Pastor Matt.

5:39 PM – Pre-Meeting called to order

Loving – Shared an Easter joy.

Learning – Shared scripture: John chapter 20 – Jesus appears to the disciples after his resurrection.

Leading – Though Thomas was doubtful of Jesus' return, the disciples readily accepted and welcomed Him. We need to show Love, Hospitality, and Patience in our church, so all feel welcome.

6 PM - Opening Prayer

Stewardship - Giving for March was \$22,980.43, expenses were \$24,898.28 leaving a deficit of \$1,917.85. Our year to date on the operating budget is -\$6,775. We are down to 3.4 months reserve in Building Fund. We like to have a full 6 months. Noted the increase in utilities, especially the gas bill.

The Budget Task Force continues to meet and have identified two initiatives:

Recurring Electronic Giving – How to encourage and assist in getting more folks utilizing this option.

Recurring giving allows for a more consistent monthly giving.

Inspiring younger folks to give. They want to know how their giving makes a difference.

SPRC – Salia Henderson (Nursery Director) gave notice and will be done at the end of April. Job has been posted with no applicants. Pastor Matt will reach out to the Kirkwood and Prairie Child Care programs to see if we can find some applicants.

The Board approved Paid Sick Leave in the form of PTO for staff. Each employee will be granted one week based on their current allotted hours. Updates will be made to current contracts starting July 1, 2022.

Trustees – AV Task Force is still awaiting the bid from one vendor, approved to review the two bids we have and proceed with recommendation as the third vendor hasn't responded.

Sanctuary Lights – Upon further review the electrical contractor is recommending a dome to keep insulation away from the lights (this is thought to overheat them and cause them to burn out sooner). We were also informed the contractor is awaiting parts as there are supply chain issues. We will be receiving additional information on the projected cost of adding

the domes, plus understanding if all lights will need to be domed right away and should lights be replaced also.

Approved approximately \$205 for hardware to mount monitor in Narthex and Nursery that will be able to live stream the services.

Miscellaneous – Have held one Town Hall Meeting with 3 others scheduled.

Meeting adjourned with prayer at 7 PM
