5:30- Pre-Meeting called to order.

Trustees - Mark Minger

Mark is working on finding replacements LED canisters for sanctuary. He checked with two companies, and they don't have them and believe we should change canister to allow a screw in LED bulb, however we do not know if the currer wiring can support. The request is to hire an electrician to review and advise on how to move forward.

A motion (Tim R, 2nd Ron) to hire an electrician was voted on and approved. Volunteers have been assisting with building cleaning and it has been much appreciated. A Fall clean up day will be scheduled. Mandatory annual buildir inspections such as fire safety, fire extinguishers and air conditioning units have bee conducted. The suppression system is scheduled. Cub Caden mower is in the shop for tune-up Mark Simonson is offering to pay for this work.

Thank you Mark for all your continued care of Salem's lawn. You are greatly appreciated.

Stewardship - Brian presented financials for July. We received \$21,778.36 and expenses were 17,249.72, with a surplus of 4,528.64. We are (\$16,743.35) short for the year. The building fund has 4.00months of reserve.

Nicole German - Presented to the board an overview of how many different softwares we use. She proposed adding

additional service to one of our current suppliers Planning Center to allow for a more robust and updated online directory. This program will allow different teams to send out a single request for scheduling/care or updates. The cost of this additional feature is \$32 per month. It will eventually lead to us cancelling several other systems allowing for a future savings. A motion (Deb F, Tim R) to expand and add on to Planning Center was voted on and approved.

Board Outreach Phone Calls - connect and thank the members of our church for their generosity. We would like to

have all members called by next board meeting September 17th.

Charge Conference Review- next steps. We have a realtor working with zoning department to establish lot lines.

3-10 CONNECT

Almost every week, someone new visits our church. As much as we may feel like home at Salem, they may feel like a stranger and it is up to us to change that. We want them to know that we are glad they are here and that they are welcome in the family of God. There is a simple concept called 3-10-connect. It means that at the end of our worship services for the first 3 minutes look around in a 10-foot radius from where you are sitting. If you see someone in that space that you don't know, extend a handshake and say hi. You could simply say, "I don't think I know you." Then introduce yourself and make conversation with them as you walk out of the sanctuary together. You see, now you have made a connection with that person and they have with you. If it turns out they have questions about our church, you can connect them further. You can physically take them to the welcome center or introduce them to a pastor, church staff member, or someone you know who can help them. The idea is 3-10-Connect. Focus on the newcomer for the first 3 minutes after worship. Know that your mission field is a 10-foot radius from where you are sitting. Connect them with another person in the church. 3-10-connect. Let's start this Sunday!

SPECIAL CHURCH CONFERENCE

Salem United Methodist Church – Special Charge Conference Sunday August 18 th Attendance Attached

Meeting called to order at 10:15 by Pastor Matt German

Introduction and opening comments from Rev. Sherrie IIG – Rev. IIG clarified that while all are welcome and can ask questions and comment on the motion, only members will be allowed to vote. She then turned the meeting over to Board Chair Donna Sanders

Mrs. Sanders spoke regarding the purpose of the proposed sell of land stating the goal was to retire the current mortgage of just over \$500K that that church carries, retain enough land for outdoor ministry endeavors and future building expansion. By retiring the mortgage, it would free up approximately \$5,400 per month. We would have additional savings in the upkeep of the property. A map was put on screen that gave an indication of what the division of the property could look like. It was made clear that this was for reference, and we would be working with others to clarify zoning restrictions and lot sizes.

The following motion from the board was presented as follows:

The leadership board moves that a portion of the Salem grounds be sold with the proceeds of the sale to be used to retire the mortgage balance carried by Salem United Methodist Church while retaining enough ground to allow for future building expansion and outdoor activities."

The floor was then opened for questions.

Question/Discussion regarding how and if we can control who could buy the property, Tim Sweet shared that we can put covenants and restrictions on the land we sell to ensure we don't end up with a neighbor that would be in direct conflict with our faith.

Question/Discussion included clarification that the board would be authorized to accept offers and sell the land without further approval. While the Board will be making the decisions they will endeavor to keep the Church congregation up to date as we move forward. This will allow for the Board to make quick decisions as often necessary with an offer to buy.

Rev. Steve Pudinski asked if we could make an amendment to the original recommendation stating the board can act as agent for the church. Tim Sweet 2nd the motion that the Board may accept all offers.

The motion was discussed and accepted.

The Updated motion reads as follows:

The leadership board moves that a portion of the Salem grounds be sold with the proceeds of the sale to be used to retire the mortgage balance carried by Salem United Methodist Church while retaining enough ground to allow for future building expansion and outdoor activities. The Board is authorized to act as an agent for the church with the ability to accept any offers for the property."

A Vote was called with the results:

55 - Yes

0 - No

1 - Abstention

The congregation was thanked for their attendance and caring for this matter.

Meeting adjourned at 10:45

HOME CARE TEAM

Ever wonder how the HCT Team knows when you're in the hospital?

Every day, a member of the Salem Care Team calls both St. Luke's and Mercy Hospitals to see if anyone affiliated with Salem UMC has been admitted.

During the admission process, a registrar updates your records.

In most instances, they will ask you, a family member, or friend if you are connected with a faith community.

When you share that you are connected with Salem UMC, that gets logged into their operator's listing so that when our HCT Team calls, your name will be listed; unless you're registered as a private patient or do not share your connection to Salem.

Often times, primary care physicians share chart information with hospitals; so if you have shared with your primary care office that you are in connection with Salem, that information also may be shared to the hospital's operator's listings.



Another option is to call the church (319.362.6178) and connect with the Director of Pastoral Care, Sandra Daniels. If she is unavailable; you are welcome to leave a message for her, send her an email at s.daniels@salemchurchcr.com, or call back to the church and select Option 2 for the Pastoral Emergency Line.
